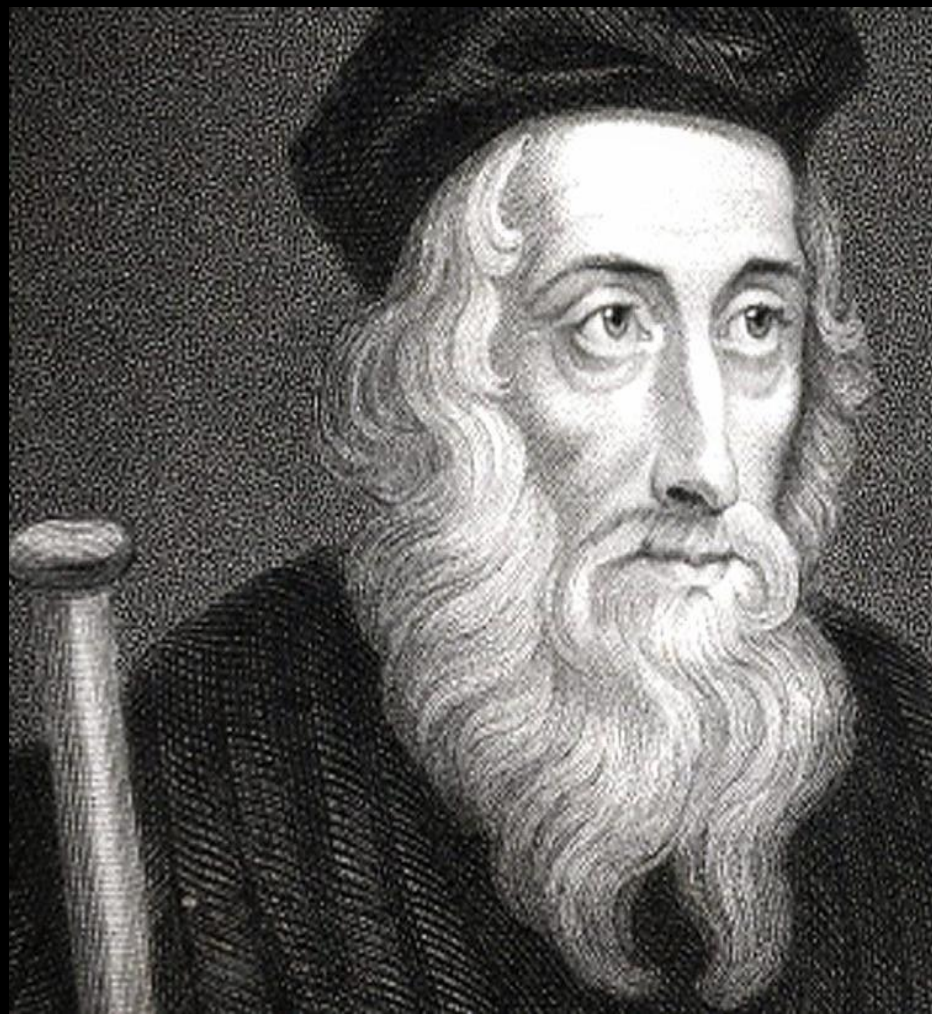
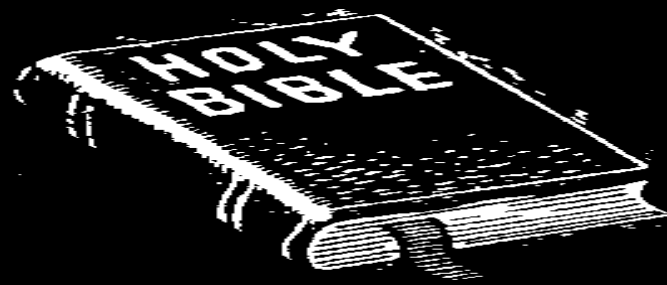

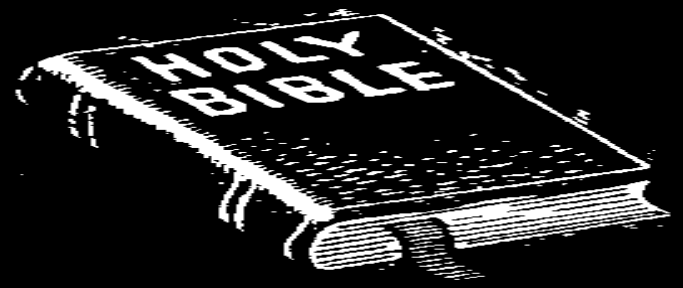
John Wycliffe:

Declared a heretic

Burning Wycliffe's bones, from [Foxe's Book of Martyrs](#) (1563)

The [Council of Constance](#) declared Wycliffe a heretic on 4 May 1415, and banned his writings. The Council decreed that Wycliffe's works should be burned and his remains removed from consecrated ground. This order, confirmed by [Pope Martin V](#), was carried out in 1428.^[21] Wycliffe's corpse was exhumed and burned and the ashes cast into the [River Swift](#), which flows through Lutterworth

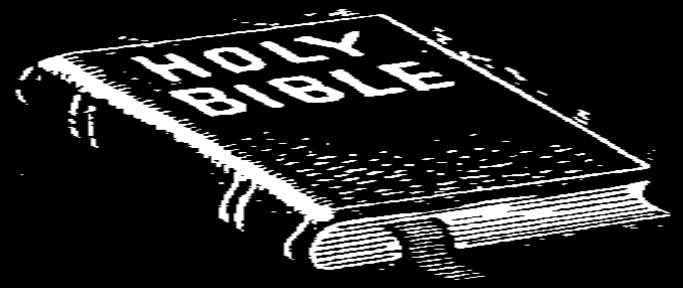

Jan Hus:

*Hus was burned at the stake in 1415, with Wycliffe's manuscript Bibles used as kindling for the fire. The last words of John Hus were that, **"in 100 years, God will raise up a man whose calls for reform cannot be suppressed."** Almost exactly 100 years later, in 1517, Martin Luther nailed his famous 95 Theses of Contention (a list of 95 issues of heretical theology and crimes of the Roman Catholic Church) into the church door at Wittenberg.*

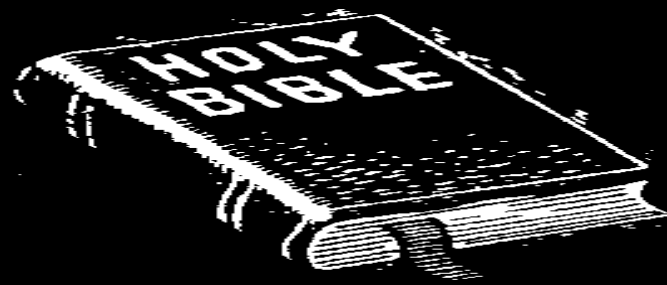


William Tyndale:

He was tried on a charge of heresy in 1536 and was condemned to be burned to death, despite [Thomas Cromwell's](#) intercession on his behalf. Tyndale "was strangled to death while tied at the stake, and then his dead body was burned".^[31] His final words, spoken "at the stake with a fervent zeal, and a loud voice", were reported as "Lord! Open the King of England's eyes."^[32]

Within four years four [English translations of the Bible](#) were published in England at the King's behest,^[a] including Henry's official [Great Bible](#). All were based on Tyndale's work.

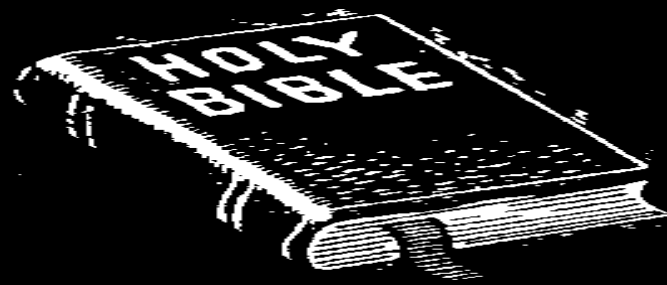


John Rogers:

In 1534, Rogers went to [Antwerp](#) as chaplain to the English merchants of the [Company of the Merchant Adventurers](#). Here he met [William Tyndale](#), under whose influence he abandoned the [Roman Catholic](#) faith. On 28 and 29 January he came before the commission appointed by [Cardinal Pole](#), and was sentenced to death by Gardiner for heretically denying the Christian character of the Church of Rome and the real presence in the sacrament. He awaited and met death cheerfully, though he was even denied a meeting with his wife. He was [burned at the stake](#) on 4 February 1555 at [Smithfield](#).

Thomas Cranmer:

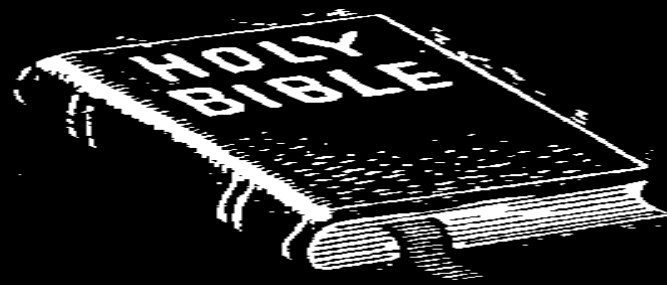
Killed by bloody Mary: On 13 November 1553 Cranmer and four others were brought to trial for treason, found guilty, and condemned to death. Throughout February 1554 Jane Grey and other rebels were executed. It was now time to deal with the religious leaders of the reformation and so on 8 March 1554 the Privy Council ordered Cranmer, Ridley, and Latimer to be transferred to [Bocardo prison](#) in Oxford to await a second trial for heresy. He then said, "And as for the pope, I refuse him, as Christ's enemy, and [Antichrist](#) with all his false doctrine."^[99] He was pulled from the pulpit and taken to where Latimer and Ridley had been burnt six months before. As the flames drew around him, he fulfilled his promise by placing his right hand into the heart of the fire while saying "that unworthy hand" and his dying words were, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit..."
